

I think I threw the first two games (Sartell 10, Carlos 0) (Sartell 2, Regal 0). Regal was the state champion the year before and I threw a one-hitter against them down at Jordan, I believe. Greg Theyer threw the game against Belle Plaine and Barry Wohler at Belle Plaine. That was quite a game there (Sartell 6, Belle Plaine 2).

I actually think we took second in the region that year. I think we were runner-up going into the state tournament. I think Loretto was the winner of the region. They had a very good team that year too. We had a loaded team that year with Theyer and myself pitching, some of the Fuchs were there. Dick Henkemeyer, he pitched a little bit in the Twins organization too. I think he pitched the finals against Detroit Lakes (Sartell 8, Detroit Lakes 6).

The only thing I can remember is, the state board, in 1995 said that since you won the MVP in 1992 we will give it to someone else in 1995. They gave it to the runner-up. They gave it to the guy I beat in the championship game. Brad Keenan won five games but blew two wins in relief and got the wins. Anyways, that's the way it went.
